# **He Hated Pigeons**

## a film by Ingrid Veninger

Canada, 2015, English/Spanish, 80 minutes. HD, Colour, Audio 5.1.

Ingrid Veninger, "Canada's DIY queen of indie filmmaking" is back with her 5<sup>th</sup> feature **HE HATED PIGEONS** and once again she has created another deliberately intimate film, this time a slow-burning odyssey about love and loss featuring newcomer Pedro Fontaine in the title role of Elias, a young man who travels from the north to the south of Chile on a cathartic journey of the spirit, and to fulfill the wish of his mysteriously deceased lover.

We are never sure just how Veninger does it, but it's clear that this fiction, just like her others, reveals a gifted filmmaker with undying respect for her actors. **Lead Actor Pedro Fontaine** "I met Ingrid while working at FEMCine, a women's film festival in Santiago last year. I was translating her Q&As. After one of the screenings, I told her I was an actor and said that we should do something together. After she left Chile, Ingrid was doing a lot of traveling with her 4<sup>th</sup> feature, THE ANIMAL PROJECT, and we stayed in touch. Then one day she told me she wanted to write a lead role for me. That's how it all started."

Cinematographer, DYLAN MACLEOD "Years ago, when we were in high school, I was directed by Ingrid in a John Guare play, THE LOVELIEST AFTERNOON OF THE YEAR. In 2000, I shot a Canadian Film Centre short, with Ingrid as producer, entitled THREE SISTERS ON MOON LAKE. Over the past years, I've attended the TIFF screenings of all features she directed, and was excited at the prospect of working with her, especially on a shoot that would travel from the north to the south of Chile."



#### INGRID VENINGER – Writer/Producer/Director

Born in Bratislava and raised in Canada, Ingrid formed pUNK Films in 2003 with a 'nothing is impossible' manifesto. Awarded the 2011 Jay Scott Prize, presented by the Toronto Film Critics Association, Ingrid Executive Produced five features with the cash award (\$5000) and launched the 1KWave in Toronto. Since 2008, Ingrid has written/produced/directed 4 features (ONLY, MODRA, i am a good person/i am a bad person, THE ANIMAL PROJECT) all of which have premiered at the Toronto International Film Festival and have garnered awards and distribution worldwide. In 2014, she initiated the pUNK Films FEMMES LAB to foster feature films written and directed by Canadian women, sponsored by Academy Award winner Melissa Leo. In October 2015, Ingrid participated in the inaugural Screenwriter's Lab at Hedgebrook on Whidbey Island, where she completed a new screenplay, ROMEO'S HEAD (working title), mentored by Jenny Bicks and recent Emmy winner Jane Anderson (Olive Kitteridge). Currently Ingrid is a member of the Film Studies Faculty at York University, and she is touring festivals with her latest feature shot in Chile, HE HATED PIGEONS -- a slow-burning odyssey about love and loss, which is presented with a uniquely improvised, ever-changing live score. www.punkfilms.ca

Originally, Veninger conceived of **HE HATED PIGEONS** to be presented with an ever-changing, improvised live score. "This project has been the most intense," says Veninger, "not because I booked the crew's flights to Chile before there was a script, or because I wrote the lead role for an actor whose work I had never seen, but because every step of the process had to allow for the added uncertainty of a live-score. Whenever possible the idea is that different musicians, in each city, improvise their own music to the film. **HE HATED PIGEONS** deals with letting go. Ideally, I want the audience to feel something which has its own intrinsic impermanence. To experience it, you have to show up."
